Let x, y, z be positive real numbers such that

$$\sqrt{x}$$
, \sqrt{y} , \sqrt{z} are sides of a triangle and $\frac{x}{y} + \frac{y}{z} + \frac{z}{x} = 5$.

Prove that

$$\frac{x(y^2 - 2z^2)}{z} + \frac{y(z^2 - 2x^2)}{x} + \frac{z(x^2 - 2y^2)}{y} \ge 0.$$
